

A booklet I have on early Gaston County homes says the Robert Alexander house was built about 1765.

It lists the Moses A. Rhyne house as built in 1865. I'm sure there was an earlier frame house on the property the family lived in.

And it lists the Alexander home home as being built in 1832 and notes He was an ancestor of R. C. G. Love. The R. C. G. home home is dated 1857.

Since N.C. colonial land grants were usually 40 acres, I think we can be sure A. P. Rhyne did buy part of the Robert Alexander land for his mill, office, and home. However, I don't believe Mr. Rhyne ever owned the ^{Alexander} house. Lafayette ("Fate") Hutchison lived in the house at one time. He was the father of C. E. Hutchison. My aunt Ada Dunn and "Fate's" daughter Stella were taught together at the Alexander home by a tutor.
